Our adults are learning daily skills through cooking, cleaning, money management, job training, social activities, and community integration, with the hope of empowering them to pursue their interests.

Residential Services

Adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities often have many overlapping support and health needs. Some adults can live independently with very little support, while others need more intensive around-the-clock assistance and medical care. Our Residential Services provide professional assistance and nursing care to help with all levels of individuals' needs, as well as teaching valuable skills for adults to enhance their independence.



When Matt started attending Adult Day Services at Capper Foundation in 2012, he preferred to be by himself or close by the one person he trusted. Today, ten years later, Matt has gained self-confidence and is trusting others while socializing and engaging in activities with his peers.

While he chooses to live independently and continues to love his privacy, Matt has expanded his horizons by joining others in making arts and crafts in our on-site art studio and enjoying public group outings. These changes have allowed him to broaden the circle of individuals he trusts and can rely on. "Over the last year and a half, Matt has truly come out of his shell and exhibited positive behaviors and actions that not many people have had the opportunity to see," shared Dorothy Robinson, Capper Program Coordinator.

Recently, Matt expressed concern for the well-being of an elderly neighbor who had passed out on his front porch. Because he doesn't know this individual very well, Matt alerted Dorothy who was able to go check on him and ensure he was alright. "In my opinion, this gentleman may have been on his porch for hours and might have stayed there if not for Matt - he saved his life," noted Dorothy.
